DEL REY HARDCOVER LINE

Del Rey Books, the science fiction arm of Ballantine, will enter the hardcover field this spring. Judy-Lynn del Rey will be the editor.

A hardcover program had been discussed before, and, in fact, Ballantine had a simultaneous hardcover program when it started in 1953 which proved unsuccess-ful, but the catalyst this time around was a single book, GLORYHITS by Bob Stickgold and Mark Moble, a DNA disaster

novel which Judy-Lynn was very high on but couldn't interest a hardcover pub-lisher in. When Al Silverman of the Book-of-the-Month club offered to take it as an alternate if there was a hardcover edition, the result was inevitable. Ron Busch, publisher of Ballantine OK'd the

STAR WARS Breaks All Records Sequel Announced

On November 19, just under six months since its May 25,1977 opening, STAR WARS since its May 25,1977 opening,51AR WARS passed JAWS as the largest grossing domestic film of all time. The total US box office sales to date is approximately \$200,000,000 and the world wide sales will probably pass \$400,000,000 sometime next year. (The film opened in England during Christmas week and is a sellout

success in France, Italy, Australia, etc.)
Leigh Brackett is writing the script
for the sequel which will start preproduction this coming fall for a January 1980 release. The choice of Leigh Brackett, well known and successful in both the science fiction and movie fields, sounds perfect

The question among SF fans is not "Have you seen STAR WARS?",but,"How many times have you seen STAR WARS?" The Coronet Theater in San Francisco had over 700,000 admissions during the 6½ month run. This was greater than the entire population of the city!

The novelization of STAR WARS sold

over 3½ million copies and spent many months on the paperback best-seller list. The music from the movie seems to be omnipresent on both radio and TV as well as being the smash hit of the disco set. The calenders blue prints portfolios,

toys,etc.,are all selling phenomenally well.

1978 should bring more of the same and will strongly affect the literary SF field as various publishers try to attract the huge STAR WARS audience. Ballantine/Del Rey books will get the Continued on page 2 col 1

Fawcett Buys Norton Package

In a spirited bidding contest,Fawcett Books,a division of CBS,bought rights to 18 older André Norton titles originally published by Harcourt Brace. The list includes many of her most famous books such as STAR MAN'S SON (1952), STAR RANGERS (1953), STAR GUARD (1955), STAR GATE (1958), and THE BEAST MASTER (1959)

The price paid was an eye-popping \$393,090,which comes to over \$20,000 per book!

Ace Books, the original paperback publisher, dropped out of the bidding fairly early. Unlike paperback originals, reprints from hardcover books come up for renewal every seven years and the huge sales of these books in the original paperback editions (some of them Continued on page 2 column)


